

## PHP Lab test

Next week you will have your first Lab based test on PHP. This test is open book, which means that you may bring and use any material you need. It will last for 60 minutes. All work must be completed in this time.

A description of what you are required to do is given below. It may also be worthwhile examining the checklist to satisfy yourself that you have covered the skills and knowledge that will be assessed in the test.

Standard University exam regulations will apply.

### ***What you are required to do***

You will have to create a PHP response page, which will print out the results collected through a web form. The web form will contain:

- Text fields
- Drop down boxes
- Buttons

The page can be structured like the examples we have seen in class, so it will grab the values from the form, test to see if the *continue* button was pressed and then print out the values as appropriate.

If the *cancel* button was pressed a simple “cancel” message should be displayed. You may have to test the values from the form to ensure that they print out fully. This will be explained on the test sheet.

The web form will be supplied electronically and in-print, so you will be able to test your code online. You will then write your code out on paper for it to be handed in.

**This work is on PHP, so there will be no marks awarded for the correct (valid) use of XHTML.**

**You will submit the coursework by WRITING the markup on a piece of paper that will be handed in at the end of the test. Any work NOT written down will NOT count or be marked.**
